WHY A FIFA FOOTBALL LAW ANNUAL REVIEW?

One of the **fundamental pillars of FIFA 2.0 is the transparency** of the organisation, its governance and the decision-making process.

In recent years, the development of **regulations and legal decisions** in various fields of FIFA's activity has become a **very relevant** issue for professionals at member associations, leagues, clubs and players' and agents' unions.

With this undeniable reality in mind, **FIFA has set itself the objective of ensuring** that football's legal stakeholders can get to know the **most relevant aspects of the field.**

Since 2019, **FIFA has been opening its doors to present the FIFA Football Law Annual Review.** Every year, FIFA shares with football's legal stakeholders the regulatory work, case law and main decisions of its decision-making and judicial bodies, as well as the main Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) proceedings arising from FIFA's decisions.

2022 was a **World Cup** year and another 365 days **of relevant regulatory changes for FIFA. Relevant decisions by the FIFA judicial bodies and CAS** were also rendered.
